It's Maple Sugarin' time at Hawthorn Hollow! Come join us as we tap our sugar bush during the month of March. Visitors will take a journey back in time and discover the magic of maple sugaring. The Sugar Maple and history of maple sugaring is an important part of Wisconsin's heritage.

Participants will experience through hands-on activities the arts and traditions of tapping a maple tree. The visit provides students with history of Native American traditions and techniques for capturing, collecting and cooking of maple syrup.

This is a **2 hour outdoor program**. Students should be dressed for the weather and wear warm coats, hats, mittens, and boots if there is snow on the ground.

This program is geared toward grades K – 5 and links with the following WI State Standards: A.4.4, B.4.1, B.4.4, B.4.7, E.4.5, E.4.6, E.4.8, F.4.1, F.4.2, F.4.3, F.4.4, H.4.1

The program will be offered during March, Tuesdays through Fridays, with morning and afternoon sessions. Each class size is limited to between 10 - 30 students, with up to two classes per session.
