Cornucopia of Fall! **October & November 2016**

This program focuses on the different ways plants grow through life stages and survive to produce new offspring. The Sugar Maple tree and history of maple sugaring is an important part of Wisconsin's heritage. Through hands-on activities, students experience the arts and traditions of maple tree identification, tapping, collecting sap, and making syrup at the sugar house. Explore the Native American traditions and techniques for making maple sugar. Students will sample 100% pure maple syrup and will make their own sumac spile to take home.

Come join us as we tap our sugar bush and take a journey back in time to discover the magic of maple sugaring during the month of March. This program focuses on the Sugar Maple as an important part of Wisconsin's heritage including the history, culture, art, and science behind maple sugaring.

Through hands-on activities, students experience:

- The arts and traditions of maple tree identification, tapping, collecting sap, and making syrup at the sugar house.
- Explore the Native American traditions and techniques for making maple sugar.
- Learn the history of Native American traditions and techniques for capturing, collecting and cooking of maple syrup.
- Make their own sumac maple sugaring spile to take home.
- Sample 100% pure maple syrup outside the sugaring house.

This is a 2 hour outdoor program. Students and chaperons should be dressed for the weather and wear warm coats, hats, mittens, and boots if the weather is cold.

Walk Hawthorn Hollow's Old Indian Trail and experience the lives of the Potawatomi. This program focuses on the Potawatomi who lived in southeastern Wisconsin for centuries and traveled through Hawthorn Hollow's grounds.

Hands-on, outdoor learning experiences:

- Discover how the Potawatomi used the natural resources around them and prepared for the different seasons.
- Practice observation skills to look for plants, animals, and other resources that the Potawatomi may have used for food, shelter, or clothing.
- Experience the natural cycles of abundance and decline that influenced the lives of the Potawatomi while investigating the causes of these natural processes.
- Travel back in time with the oral tradition of storytelling in a tipi.
- Plant a Three Sisters garden of corn, beans, and squash.
- Explore how lifestyles have changed over the past 300 years.

This is a 2 hour outdoor program. Students and chaperons should dress for the weather.
